



#### Club Forum-PE Carol Constantine

This week we enjoyed an interactive session run by President Elect Carol that had three themes.

She firstly outlined some of the history of Rotary with an entertaining jigsaw activity. Formed in 1905 by Paul Harris and four colleagues, with the aim of fostering business networks, Rotary quickly grew. Before long a major component became a focus on community service. The core values of Rotary became established with the articulation of the Four Way Test, still a statement that binds all Rotary members together. Key events that struck a chord our members were the decision to allow women to join Rotary, which happened in 1987, and the formation of our Club in 2004. One comment that was endorsed by many others in the room was that the inclusion of guite a number of women in our Club has been of great benefit to our Club. Next year, 2024, will provide an opportunity to mark and celebrate our 20 year history.

This activity was followed by a period of reflection on what the Club has achieved over its 20 year history. The results will be collated and circulated for further discussion. The proliferation of sticky notes that appeared detailed many of the projects, both International and local, that have been achieved. Mention was made of the opportunity

for service, the friendly atmosphere, the growth of friendships, the Youth programs that we run, plus many other aspects.

The third session was the chance to make suggestions about things that members would like to see in the future. Again the sticky notes were many, with suggestions such as more local and hands-on projects, extending our support for Family Care Uganda, and developing our membership program. We look forward to seeing the wide spectrum of ideas when the notes are collated and distributed.

Carol will follow up on this evening at the next Club forum, to be held on May 9th.


