Newsletter 37 2022-2023

At a recent Days for Girls sewing day, the Chief Operating Officer Mary Connelly-Gale, gave an update on the growth of Days for Girls in Oceania. Following on from training in Brisbane last November, there are now sewing teams in Fiji, PNG, Timor Leste, West Timor and the Marshall Islands. The training of these leaders and provision of various items of equipment have been assisted by funds from the DG Partner Project in 2021-2022.

The growth of these teams reflects the evolving philosophy of Days for Girls to ensure sustainability of the production of these hygiene kits. To this end there are now regions of the world, the 'blue regions', where any kits distributed must be produced locally. A great deal of effort has been made with training leaders to ensure that the kits are manufactured to the gold standard, to ensure they last for at least three years. The success of this shift in thinking has been very evident in the data: from 2008 to mid 2021, just over 78,000 girls and women received kits in Kenya. In the single year of 2021, over 79,000 girls and women were reached in Kenya, an astounding result.

An exciting event coming up will be the opportunity to meet the founder of Days for Girls, Celeste Mergens, at a breakfast on May 27th. Bookings are still open for this event, with the chance to hear a truly remarkable speaker. Details of how to book are in last week's newsletter.
