Some of the aspects of the Convention that will be enjoyed by our Club members are:

- The Signature Event—'Night at the Museum' on Saturday 27th. Our Club members are acting as
 volunteers for this event, which will involve welcoming the visitors and directing them to the
 Museum from various bus and tram stops in the vicinity. It is exciting that the RI President
 Jennifer Jones will be attending this event.
- 2. Opening General Session on Sunday 28th 10am—12pm at the Rod Laver Arena. There will be a parade of flags which gives a very impressive display of the countries in the world in which Rotary operates, plus world class entertainment. With around 15,000 entering the arena, those attending are advised to arrive with plenty of time to enter and find a seat. RI President Jennifer Jones will be welcomed to this session with her family and will share her insights from her year as PresidentE
- 3. Visiting the House of Friendship, in the Melbourne Convention and Entertainment Centre (MCEC) which will be open from 9 am on Saturday 27th, with the Grand Opening at 11.00 on this day. The range of booths is enormous and shows the vast range of programs run by Rotary clubs and affiliated groups around the world. There will be rolling entertainment in the House of Friendship and places to eat.



4. Key Note Speakers such as Leymah Gbowee, 2011 Nobel Peace Laureate and Founder of the Gbowee Peace Foundation Africa.

Ms. Gbowee's leadership of the Women of Liberia Mass Action for Peace – which brought together Christian and Muslim women in a nonviolent movement that played a pivotal role in ending Liberia's civil war – is chronicled in her memoir, Mighty Be Our Powers, and in the award-winning documentary, Pray the Devil Back to Hell.

5. Signature Event— Streets of Melbourne South Wharf on Tuesday 30th. The area at South Wharf will be closed to the general public and will provide the opportunity for Rotarians from our Club to enjoy a meal and mix with others from around the world.

6. Breakout Sessions—the list of breakout sessions is three pages long and covers topics as diverse as 'Reverse Mentoring—Empowering Young Leaders', 'Of Mothers, Children, Plastics and Waste',' Measuring Impact: A Workshop on Project Evaluation', 'A Hospital off the Beaten Path'. 
Page 4 Knox Nocturnals Youth Program

Planning is well underway for the Cluster project, Knox Nocturnals Youth Program, with Club members Carol and Jenny on the Steering Committee and Alan using his expertise to set up the Trybooking registration. The project is being co-ordinated by Christine Anderson from RC Ferntree Gully.

This program is a great community initiative that supports and connects young people aged 12 to 18 years who are at risk or isolated, providing a safe and inclusive environment in which to interact.

The program combines a healthy dinner with a rotation of activities including sport, street dance, art, music, fitness, personal development and life-skills workshops, all run by qualified youth workers in the relevant area. The aim of the program is to provide the opportunity for healthy socialization, to build connections with other young people and the adult mentors, to increase confidence and self-esteem, to learn life skills and to have fun, with increased positive behaviours as an outcome.

The sessions will be held every second Friday night in term time, 6.30 pm to 9.30 pm, starting 14 July 2023. The venue will be Fairhills Secondary College, 330 Scoresby Road, Knoxfield.



This project will provide an excellent opportunity for Club members to be involved in a hands-on project that has the potential to change the lives of young people in our local community. More detail will be provided in the near future with the opportunity to indicate when you are available and which role would be of interest to you. We look for great support from all our members in this new project.

Knox Nocturnals Youth Program is a Knox Empowering Communities project funded by the Victorian Government's Empowering Communities initiative as part of the Building Safer Communities Program.


