



This week's speaker— PDG Daryl Moran Regionalisation in Zone 8

This week the focus was on understanding what is involved in the move to a **pilot** project to restructure Rotary in Australia, NZ and the Pacific Region by introducing a regional governance structure.

The aim is to transform Rotary and Rotaract in our region to better support Clubs to provide relevant and engaging experiences that serve our communities and enable us to grow. This will enable us to significantly increase our reach and impact.

This will:

- support clubs to engage members, volunteers and communities
- Create new attractive leader ship opportunities

- Build a stronger, unified Rotary brand
- Encourage partnerships
- Improve efficiencies and reduce duplication

The Principles of a regional structure could involve:

- Democratically elected Regional Councils with supporting committees and area leaders.
- Area leaders would be elected by the 10-25 clubs they would support.
- Any Rotarian or Rotaractor can nominate self or others for all roles.
- Representation is important geography, gender etc.
- Collect the best resources from around Zone 8 to help and support every club.
- 2—4 year terms.

In September there will be a vote:

To explore, develop and test alternative ways of operating OR

To not be involved in the pilot.

Rotary International advice on voting rules:

- a. One vote per club.
- b. Abstaining by any club is a NO vote.
- c. Two thirds majority of clubs voting YES required
- d. Clubs vote first, then districts.

The process that is envisaged is shown below.



Stage 1: To end of 2022



Stage 2: To mid 2023



Stage 3: To mid 2024



Stage 4: To mid 2026

Planning – design, transition and implementation

Election/selection and training of Regional office bearers and Area Leaders Transfer of initial District functions to Region

Further transfer functions from districts.
2 year pilot complete

Parallel operation of Regional Model and Districts.

Monitoring and evaluation.

In addition to delivering the official RI presentation, Daryl highlighted two aspects of this proposal that he feels are significant.

There is a pressing need to halt the declining membership numbers in Rotary in Zone 8 that has been underway for a decade. There has been a lot of discussion of ways to do this, with little effect to date. The structural changes that will be possible with Regionalisation may be the way of making Rotary more relevant, compelling and impactful into the future.

A second aspect is the benefits that can follow from having a single voice to speak for Rotary. This could give Rotary a higher profile in its activities, such as response to natural disasters, and make it easier to communicate with Government and sponsors.



In summary, Regionalisation could bring the benefits of:

- ONE Rotary Voice in Zone 8
- ONE Learning and Development platform
- 3. ONE Rotary entity to deal with Government and sponsors
- 4. Districts may disappear to create a flatter structure to assist clubs
- 5. Can draw on Zone 8 resources
- Less fragmentation and disconnection across the Zone




