Rotary responds: support for Ukraine

The Rotary Foundation and Rotary clubs around the world have hurried to provide funds, supplies, and services to Ukrainians displaced by the war. The Rotary Foundation has raised more than **\$15 million**

in contributions that are already helping provide people in Ukraine with essential items such as water, food, shelter, medicine, and clothing.



Since the invasion of Ukraine, Rotary Clubs worldwide have responded swiftly with funds, supplies and services. In the countries neighbouring Ukraine, Rotarians are helping refugees in a variety of ways. In Ukraine itself Rotary numbers have grown dramatically as people see the potential for Rotary with its broad reach and its known integrity.

Daryl finished by reminding us that we should feel very proud to be part of an organisation that can be so effective in helping in times of hardship.

Page 3 Recycling

Thanks to Murray and Kaye, there is a large bag of used stamps to be delivered to Camille Rogers from the Rotary Club of Glen Waverley.

Camille reports that she has processed over 3000 stamps this financial year but I think that the total will increase dramatically with the collection from Murray, and many Aveo residents.

A reminder for anyone collecting their used stamps that it is best if they are cut from the envelope with a border of at least 5 mm.

Other items to recycle

- Foreign coins can be delivered to Ron Brooks at RC Forest Hills.
- Aluminium tablet blister packs (not the ones with plastic coating) and empty toothpaste tubes can be returned to Biome at Brickworks in Burwood. Jenny is happy to deliver these.
- **Corks** from bottles of bubbly. Pass these on to Murray.
- **Empty makeup containers** (even with a bit of residue left) can be delivered to any Priceline store.
- **Soft plastics** such as shopping bags, biscuit packets, chip packets, plastic wrapping from toilet paper etc, can be returned to Woolworths or Coles. Look for the big recycle bin near the front entrance.
- Plastic bottle tops from milk bottles etc. There is the means once again to recycle these, so please wash them, collect them and bring them to a meeting, so they can be passed on to a contact at NADRASCA.

- Rotaract Macrame 'n' Sip night Friday 30th—last chance to book a ticket. It should be a fun night so we look forward to a good representation from the Club.
- Our Club has been successful in applying to Bunnings for a donation of some timber to restore a cubby house for a child with a life-limiting disease. The cubby house is being provided by 'Backyard Blitz' in conjunction with local landscaping and plumbing businesses. Bunnings support for Community Projects is very much appreciated.
- A Global Grant application has been submitted to District for \$9,000 for Backpacks 4 Vic Kids.
- Grant submissions have been made for an allocation of funds from Balwyn Rotary Club to go to Uganda Family Care and SHEBA. We look forward to hearing whether these applications have been successful.
- * The SALT program (Sport and Life Training), which is essentially a suicide prevention program, is continuing, thanks to Murray.






